7. FIRST AID COURSE (HLTAID003) - 30 March 2019

- 7.1. JCC will be running a first aid course on 30 March 2019
- 7.2. Need a minimum of 8 people and maximum of 14 people to hold the course
- 7.3. Cost will be \$99 for members and \$110 for non-members, lunch will be provided

- 8. MEMBER PROPOSAL Vicky Kerfoot: Gooralong bridge
 - **8.1.** Friends of the Park (?) have created a proposal to install a bridge across Gooralong Brook in the land below Jarrahdale Road in the Heritage Park
 - 8.2. The bridge would assist in linking other trails and meets near the railway line
 - 8.3. Access to areas of interest will also be made more accessible throughout the trails
 - 8.4. Friends of the Park had a good meeting with the National Trust regarding their proposal
 - **8.5.** The National Trust has the proposal and is looking over it, as is the SJ Shire and they are communicating in regards to this proposal
 - **8.6.** The bridge will cost approximately \$20,000
 - 8.7. <CALL OUT> for any engineers that may be able to assist in looking over the plans
 - Vicky Kerfoot has drawings available at the sub engineering level

- 9. MEMBER PROPOSAL Morag Cook: Community skillshare/foodshare
 - 9.1. Proposal 1 Swap/share/food community shed based on the Grow Free movement
 - Base idea is to have a non consumer community shed available to swap and share food and produce
 - This will also have the added benefit to assist in connecting the community
 - Notes:
 - School used to run a similar concept Glut Cleaners would turn residents excess fruit into jams, etc. Volunteers burnt out and it wasn't sustainable
 - School currently has a stand in school grounds where excess produce is brought in and can be taken for donations to the School's P&C
 - The School's *Project Play* incorporates redoing the school entrance, potentially the share shed could be integrated along with the free library
 - Morag Cook to meet with Alicia Caruso and Julie Denholm to discuss the potential
 - 9.2. Proposal 2 Repair Cafe based on current Repair Cafe's across the world
 - Base idea is to have regular meets where residents can bring items to be repaired
 - Ideas for repair cafe:
 - SJ Mens Shed could potential partner (not all members agreed with this idea)
 - Quilt group
 - o IT repairs
 - Basic carpentry
 - JCC repair cafe is suggested to be initiated with an event then move forward to more frequent workshops
 - 9.3. Proposal 3 Skill Share Database
 - JCC to start building a database of the skillsets of Jarrahdale residents that are willing to share/swap their skills for other assistance (eg. person 1 could mow person 2's lawn and in return person 2 would pave an area for person 1)
 - This could be initiated through social media or via the website
 - **9.4.** Full in depth proposal is available on request by emailing info@jarrahdalecc.org
 - 9.5. Moved to accept all 3 proposals and the JCC to start working on these

11. UPDATES FROM CR MICHELLE RICH

- 11.1. Land that houses the old rotunda, used to be the old electric mill site
 - The SJ Shire has received an expression of interest
 - Developments from the EOI will dictate what the area will look like
 - RV Centre may be moved depending on the development of the EOI
- 11.2. Plans for Jarrahdale oval
 - To get funding the Shire has to have a plan ready to show what they want the funding for
 - In the general vicinity of Jarrahdale oval has been earmarked for equine trail head hub
 - · These facilities will makeway for national events to be held in the area
 - · Water tanks have been installed recvently
 - Toilets are not up to standard and need to be replaced
 - To keep utilising Jarrahdale oval money needs to be spent that the Shire does not have.
 They will be watching for:
 - Potential grant funding will be tracked
 - Election commitment funding
- 11.3. Peel trail strategy due for release May 2019
 - Shire is working on its own trail strategy which will feed into the Jarrahdale oval plans

11.4. Jarrahdale Road

- Cr Rich understands it is a headache but please bear with them
- The upgarde is NOT for heavy haulage
- Upgrade is for the safety of residents and visitors to the area
- Last council meet 18 February council endorsed their officers recommendation to replace both bridges on Jarrahdale Road
 - Both are old timber bridges, have timber rot and termites
 - o Cr Rich believes it was a bit over \$1 million to replace the bridges
 - The Shire's engineering department has been able to secure funding from both the Federal and State governments for 90% of the costs. The Shire needs to cover the remaining 10%.
 - Needs to be completed by 2022
- 11.5. Water corp pipeline issue/New Jarrahdale group
 - Cr Rich has discussed further with the Peel Development Commission
 - Dwellingup had a local member of Parliament that pushed theirs
 - The SJ Shire does not have a local member that is in government which makes it harder for them but the Shire has picked it up and is taking the lead on this issue
 - Shire is in the process of sending letters to form a group and hopefully in th next month they will see movement on this front

- Dwellingup has established a group and called it Dwellingup Futures, Jarrahdale need to think of something better
- The group would draw skillbase from all the existing groups that are in Jarrahdale
- Group will tackle Jarrahdale's unique issues it is facing
 - Alcoa coming in quite close, already in Northern Jarrahdale Forests which is realistically Jarrahdale which is causing grave concerns
 - They also have concerns regarding the water supply to Jarrahdale
 - Current pipeline is a 4 inch asbestos pipe full of holes and plugged with sticks to stop it leaking
 - Pipe is not on Water Corp maintenance schedule anywhere and it should be
 - Other issues that come about in the future through this group's journey
- Group is a work in progress and they are having discussions at the high level to start coming back down and get something happening
